On November 20th I reached out by email to 110 nursing school administrators across the state. By the time Mid-Winter came and went, over 50 administrators and/or schools had reached out and either requested additional information or just said "Thank You".

I was amazed how many schools with nursing programs, stated that they had never been contacted...numerous administrators asked "why it was the first time that they had heard about this LONG RUNNING PROGRAM"? I could not answer!

Let us set a goal that in future years...we ALL need to reach out and notify our local universities and colleges, that have nursing programs, about the scholarship offers.

Now is the time to follow up with the nursing schools in your area. They all have been notified ... you just need to take that one extra step. All I am asking is a simple email or phone call to follow-up and see if there is a way YOU or YOUR AUXILIARY or YOUR DISTRICT can assist the school in spreading the word.

A list of the schools was provided in print, to each District President at the StateWide Training. I will also gladly supply a link; you just need to email me and request it.

As of the writing of this article, <u>I have received 10</u> <u>Nursing Scholarship Applications</u>. The applications are being accepted through postmark date March 31st. WOW – Going to be a great year!

Being that so many have already been received and with over a month to go. And, being that our District and my own Auxiliary has sponsored numerous applicants in the past (one year our Auxiliary sponsored 10 applicants) I would like to give each nursing scholarship applicant this year, a local Auxiliary and/or District contact that is willing to sponsor them AND to reward them with at the minimum some word or action of "Thanks."

I absolutely had a fantastic and informative time! I always love getting the chance to see old friends, network with everyone and meet new friends!! With spring break coming up in March please make sure you stay on task and get your

March 3rd, Star Spangled Banner Day

March 13th, K-9 Veterans Day

March 21st, is Rosie the Riveter Day

March 25th, is Medal of Honor Day

March 29th, is National Vietnam War Veterans Day

While we were at State Convention, I asked everyone to research and report back to me about March 21st, Rosie the Riveter Day for a lesser-known patriotic holiday! For the ones that don't know Rosie the Riveter was the star of a campaign aimed at recruiting female workers for the defense industry, factory industry and other jobs during World War II.

All the men had enlisted into the war leaving no one here to make the airplanes or the ammunition or anything else for the war or for the home front. That is when the "Rosie the Riveters" stepped up to keep the War and the World going while our Warriors were fighting over seas with the slogan "We Can Do it".

By 1940 the female percentage of the US Workforce was almost 37% then by 1945 one in every four women worked outside the home.

While I was traveling to District #25, I got the absolute pleasure of meeting and even got a hug from the daughter of a real life "Rosie the Riveter" her mother worked as a riveter/bucker on the wings of the airplanes because she has small enough to fit in the wings!!

More than 310,000 women worked in the US aircraft industry in 1943, making up 65% of the industries total workforce compared to just 1% in the pre-war years!!

Mae Krier is one of the original Rosie the Riveters of WWII and has been fighting for Women's Rights ever since. She was born in Dawson, North Dakota in 1926, she had an uncle that was in Guadalcanal, then she heard about the bombing on Pearl Harbor, she knew then she wanted to do something to help. Mae, her sister and several friends got a job at Boeing and started working on B-17s and B-29s. In May of 1944 they built the 5,000th B-17 since Pearl Harbor and all the "Rosies" got to paint their name on it and push it out on the tarmac!!

On April 17th, 2018 Mae Krier got "Rosie the Riveter Day" approved through congress. Then on April

10th,2024 in Washington DC Mae Krier and other "Rosie the Riveters" accepted the Congressional Medal of Honor on behalf of all the Rosies. For more info on this amazing era of women please visit rosietheriveter.org.
