We are so close to hitting that 100% for Texas!! Splendid work, everyone!

One of the things that slows down membership being entered is the applications not being complete and missing key information. We thought another quick rundown of the necessary information might be helpful.

<u>First</u>, please make sure you are using the most recent application from MALTA or the VFW Auxiliary website. In the bottom right-hand corner, it should say "*Revised February 2024*."

Second, at the top it says **Applicant completes** sections A, B, C or D and F. Auxiliaries/ **Department complete section E.** Please be sure these sections are completed.

The most common things left out of the application are:

- 1. Birthdate of applicant.
- 2. Name, medals and location of foreign service of the applicant's qualifying Veteran, if non-affiliated with a Post.
- 3. Signatures of the Investigating Committee.
- 4. Date of the meeting the application was voted on and approved. <u>Please be sure all these items</u> are filled in before sending the application in.
- 5. Signature of applicant.

These items are **all** necessary and the application cannot be processed without them.

REMEMBER, don't "leaf" any qualifying member behind. Be sure to keep the QR code on your phone. It is the easiest way to share information about the organization and the application. Check back with them in a week. Don't let them lose interest or feel they weren't important enough.

We want to see Texas make 100% plus in Membership! Keep up the good work on recruiting new members! As always, if we can help, let us know!

Don't forget ... National Nurses Week begins each year on May 6th and ends on May 12th, Florence Nightingale's birthday. These permanent dates enhance planning and position National Nurses Week as an established recognition event. As of 1998, May 8 was designated as National Student Nurses Day, to be celebrated annually. And as of 2003, National School Nurse Day is celebrated on the Wednesday within National Nurses Week (May 6-12) each year.

The nursing profession has been supported and promoted by the American Nurses Association (ANA) since 1896. Each of ANA's state and territorial nurse's associations promotes the nursing profession at the state and regional levels. Each conducts celebrations on these dates to recognize the contributions that nurses and nursing make to the community.

Greetings

We had a lot of excitement for the month of March. Commander in Chief Alfred Lipphardt along with many of our VFW Veterans and Auxiliaries attended the Joint Hearing Committees of Veterans' Affairs United States Senate and the United States House of Representatives in Washington DC.

It was advocating for our Veterans at its finest. The contract that was signed by all whom volunteer to serve within our military forces was discussed. Commander Lipphardt stated the following "While the benefits we afford our all-volunteer force may seem generous to those who never raised their right hands and took the Oath of Enlistment, these benefits are simply the warranty of all-volunteer service contracts—DD Form 4—each of us signed before we put on the uniform. In addition to the service member's obligations, each contract explicitly entitles the service members to certain benefits as a result of honorable service. This is why the VFW calls on our nation to honor the contract."

To read the full statement goggle Congressional Statement of VFW National Commander Alfred J. "Al" Lipphardt. Section 9 is a must read to better understand what our Veterans volunteered for and why these benefits are much deserving,

The above statement should not only inspire us but also motivate us to continue to be strong advocates for our Veteran's rights, for it was our family members that dedicated their lives for this country. So, continue to be aware and respond to all action alerts and read, advocate and engaged.

I encourage you to share our Commander's article with others to help them to understand why signing up for Action Corps Weekly and responding to the alerts is so important. Our VFW National Commander in Chief is leading the way and we must do our utmost to help in protecting our veteran's rights.
